



Local environmental project receives funding boost

East Freo Farm is one of 20 community environmental organisations across Australia to have been awarded a Be Natural Landcare Community Garden Grant.

Grants of up to \$2,500 were awarded to community groups and schools working on a range of projects including developing community gardens from the ground up, planting harmony and interactive sensory gardens, hosting bush tucker workshops, collecting seeds to propagate seedlings and much more.

East Freo Farm volunteers will use the funding to lead a project aimed at planting citrus trees in unused spaces around the town of East Fremantle. Members of the community will benefit from local organic produce and will also have the opportunity to maintain and care for the trees within a positive community space.

Rebecca James of East Freo Farm is looking forward to putting the Be Natural Landcare Grant of \$2313 to good use.

"With our community garden now well established, this grant will allow us to widen our reach and get local residents involved in establishing local organic food sources throughout the neighbourhood," she said.

The 20 funded projects all share the common theme of focusing on engaging with local communities, fostering grass-roots projects, encouraging sustainable living and raising awareness of the importance of local environmental action.

Be Natural spokesperson, Nik Scotcher, is happy to be able to support such worthy projects that see people connecting with the natural environment.

"It's great to see communities come together and develop plans for such innovative and worthwhile projects.
